Biographical Counselling SKILLS FOR SOCIAL PROFESSIONS

Biographical Counselling is a holistic, integrative counselling approach that takes into account the psychological, social and spiritual dimensions of human experience. It offers a way of working that encourages people to find their own agency and creative freedom with their ideals, tasks and responsibilities. It aims to address issues on the level of healing and self development where crises and challenges become opportunities for growth and renewal.

This one-year, interactive course offers participants an in-depth experience of working with their own biography to explore their life events objectively and from within the framework of cosmic lawfulness. By looking at archetypal life-phases and using a variety of artistic approaches, we will support you in understanding your own unique place and purpose. Participants will be encouraged to creatively explore their questions, life themes and repeating patterns in a way that will enhance both their self-knowledge and professional practice.

The course will offer an introduction to counselling, outlining a framework for developing speaking and listening skills to enable transformative dialogue. These counselling tools will help form the basis of positive communication that moves from polarisation to enquiry, from conflict to love and from rigidity to possibility. We will interweave the past, the present, and develop an awareness of what is coming towards us from the future.

The course is informed by a variety of approaches to counselling and psychotherapy, particularly inspired by thinkers and practitioners who offer an understanding of body, soul and spirit, and embraces the search for meaning. It is grounded in ideas arising from Anthroposophy, an approach outlined by Rudolf Steiner.

Biographical Counselling originated in the UK, and trainings have been developed in Russia, South America and Israel. It is part of a world-wide movement of Biography Work as founded by Bernard Lievegoed (1905-1992) which has been developed for us in coaching and organisation development.

Applicants

The course will be of interest to teachers, therapists, psychologists, coaches, doctors and nurses, faith workers and other professionals who are interested in human encounter and who wish to deepen their own path of self development. We welcome applicants where there are differences in age, class, culture, disability, race, gender and sexuality.

Entry Requirements

Qualification

A Certificate of Biographical Counselling Skills is awarded by the PABC on successful completion of the course.

The course offers 180 hours of CPD.



Course Structure September 2024 to June 2025

The course will be run face to face over two, five-day sessions at the beginning and end of the course, and six weekends throughout the year. There will be two online seminars within the year. A written piece of work and presentation will be expected.
